Greetings to all !!! Its been a busy 6 months as you may know, Hga was present at the annual conference in DC and thereafter was advocating for gifted education from a local and national viewpoint. Funding was always an issue as we advocated for support for the Javits funds again in 2017 for 2018. advocacy efforts continue to make Gifted education a high priority. Communication with both State Senators will remain essential come March '18 on the Hill.

Come summer we were ready to follow up with college planning, resources

workshop/ mid year budget hoping to maintain a stable scholarship fund. We were fortunate to be able to hold board meeting at the CRC site due to Board Member Patrick.
