

The George B. Carter Serteens Club of Hawaii has been serving gifted and talented teens in Hawaii for over 40 years by providing opportunities for social interaction, service to the community, leadership training, and financial aid through scholarships.

In 1972, the Oahu chapter of Sertoma, a non-profit organization, elected to serve the gifted and talented students of Hawaii. This group, under the charge of Colonel Ed Jurkens and Major George B. Carter founded The Serteens Club of Hawaii.

In July 2004, the club was renamed the George B. Carter Serteens Club of Hawaii to honor the man who devoted his life to motivating gifted and talented teens both here and abroad. In 2011, George Carter passed away but the club he helped found continues to serve the community. Today, over a thousand of Hawaii's gifted and talented students have been a part of Serteens and many have come back to serve as Sertomans.

Upcoming events include the club's Appreciation Banquet, celebrating the accomplishments of the year, graduating seniors, and announcement our scholarship award winners. In July we have our Leadership Camp, a three-day camp held at Camp Erdman. This camp is the first camp for the new members to participate in team-building activities, campfires, and games. Mini-workshops on self-awareness, planning, and prioritization also prepare members for the highlight of the year: The Knights Motivational Camp which is held in February.
